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Pre-treatment/Aftercare Pre-Treatment

- 1. Make sure the hair is long enough for most people this is 3-4 days' worth of growth. This allows the provider the ability to see hair density and courseness. (Usually the length of a rice grain)
- 2. Remove any makeup on areas to be treated.
- 3.Get as comfortable as possible during the treatment.
- 4. Eliminate as much stress as possible on the day of the appointment.
- 5. Your diet can affect your sensitivity. Avoid stimulants like caffeine, chocolate, or sugar one day before your appointment and on the day of your appointment.
- 6. Avoid sun exposure 48 hours before your treatment to avoid dilation of the blood vessels.
- 7. Do not use Retin A, Tazorac, or any serious retinoid for at least 5 days before your electrolysis treatment. Discontinue Accutane for at least 6 months before electrolysis.
- 8. Some clients may find that they are more sensitive during or right before their menstrual cycle and may want to avoid making appointments during that time.
- 9. Many topical numbing creams are available either with or without a prescription. EMLA (by prescription) and Greencaine (non-prescription) are commonly used.
- 10. Some find a meal just before treatment helps reduce discomfort.
- 11. Drink plenty of water the day before, the day of, and the day after the treatment. Dehydrated follicles are more difficult to treat. Hydration will also help your skin heal more quickly. Keep in mind drinking alcohol the night before an appointment can dehydrate you.

Aftercare

- 1. Following your treatment, do not touch or scratch the area treated. This can cause bacteria to transfer to the treated area. This will cause a breakout (whiteheads).
- 2. Moisturize the treatment area daily between sessions with a gentle, unscented moisturizer.
- 3. Do not wear make-up over the treated area for 24 hours. Even washing with soap can cause irritation and possible infection.
- 4. Avoid perfume or alcohol-based products. They will dry out your skin. You can wipe the area with witch hazel if needed.
- 5. You can apply aloe vera or Vaseline to the treated area the night after your treatment. This will help your skin heal even faster, especially facial areas. Apply with Q-tips or clean hands. If your skin is still irritated on the second day, apply a Hydrocortisone cream (Cortisone, Cortaid, or anything with 1% hydrocortisone or hydrocortisone acetate). It is anti-inflammatory and will reduce redness and swelling. Also works on pimples!
- 6. Avoid the sun for the next 72 hours to avoid the formation of brown pigment spots. Your skin defends against UV rays by producing pigment, which will deflect some of the harmful rays. If your skin is injured or traumatized it can over-produce pigment in those areas. This can result in hyperpigmentation.
- 7. Do not swim in a chlorinated pool for the first 48 hours following treatment.
- 8. If small scabs appear, do not scratch them away. This can cause scarring. Allow them to fall off naturally. This is nature's way of healing the follicle that we have treated. (the scabs are lymph fluid that has drained out of the follicle and dried up) Keeping the area moisturized will often curtail the formation of scabs. If discomfort should occur in closely treated areas apply an Epsom salt compress: Add 1 tsp. Epsom Salt to 1/2 cup warm water, mix, and soak up with a washcloth. Lay the washcloth over the treated area for 10 minutes and repeat until the discomfort subsides.
- 9. If you are prevented from coming in as soon as you would like for your next treatment, DO NOT TWEEZE! The offending hair can be clipped off with small scissors or shaved.
- 10. Remember: Some re-growth is to be expected. If you reschedule when the first re-growth occurs, the roots are shorter and weaker and therefore can be treated more effectively.

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What causes unwanted hair growth?

Many things can cause excess hair growth including; heredity, hormone levels, medications, temporary hair removal methods (i.e. waxing, tweezing, threading, etc.), and illnesses. It is also common for women to have unwanted hair growth during puberty, pregnancy, and menopause.

How does Electrolysis work!

Electrolysis involves the insertion of a fine pre-sterilized, disposable probe into the hair follicle. The skin is not punctured or harmed. A slight amount of current is then applied through the probe. Effective treatment of the mid and lower follicles accomplishes permanent hair removal by destroying the dermal papilla (the blood supply to the hair). When the dermal papilla is completely deactivated, no further hair growth can occur. If in initial treatment, a hair is only damaged an undernourished weaker hair will grow. This hair will be finer and more susceptible to treatment.

Are there different kinds of Electrolysis!

Yes, there are three different methods of Electrolysis; Galvanic, Thermolysis, and The Blend. All three modalities are safe and effective, and equally, destroy hair germ cells that cause hair growth. The modality used is the preference of the professional Electrologist.

Galvanic – Direct current (DC). This is a chemical method that utilizes a direct current to convert normal body salt and water in the follicle into a compound capable of destroying the dermal papilla. The chemical is produced only in the follicle and does not affect any other area.

Thermolysis – Alternating current (AC), sometimes referred to as high frequency or short-wave: This is a method that uses a high-frequency current to produce heat in the hair follicle. This heat cauterizes and destroys the dermal papilla.

The Blend Method (also referred to as Dual Modality): The Blend method combines both currents (sequentially or simultaneously) in the same probe. Thermolysis enhances the action of the galvanic method to produce a faster process.

Is it safe!


Yes! Electrolysis has had a history of safe and effective hair removal since 1875. Our equipment is sterilized before each treatment and we use a brand new sterilized probe for each session so there is never any chance of cross-contamination.

Does Electrolysis hunt!

Today, most of our clients describe the sensation of electrolysis as "quick warmth" or a "slight sting". Some areas may be more sensitive than others and at certain times of the month, you may feel more sensitive. Over-the-counter products like numbing creams are also available for those who are more sensitive. Taking your favorite pain reliever 30 minutes before an appointment can also lessen the sensation of treatment.

Are there side effects!

You may see slight redness and/or swelling but this is normal and these mild symptoms typically lessen anywhere from ½ hour to a few hours post-treatment. After hair is treated, it leaves an open follicle that is prone to bacteria. Keeping the area clean and avoiding makeup or harsh products on the area for 24 hours is advised.



Consultation

The consultation takes about 15-20 minutes and is \$30.00 that must be prepaid in order to hold your spot as a new patient. Please let the provider know if you have any questions or concerns. There are no children allowed in the procedure room. Thank you for understanding!

If you are scheduled for an appointment and "no call, no show", the full amount of the service will be due before you can rebook. Also, if you arrive late for an appointment, the provider can only work for the appointment slot that you have reserved. Furthermore, the provider cannot work over the scheduled time, as it is by appointment only.

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Electrolysis Hair Removal Consent Form

Electrolysis treatments are a form of electrical epilation where a wire filament (needle) is inserted into the hair follicle and a minimal amount of current is delivered to the root of the hair to destroy it through a variety of modalities. All modalities will treat only the offending hair follicle, making this a non-invasive and more direct route to target unwanted hair.

Galvanic Electrolysis - Galvanic electrolysis is the oldest type of hair removal. The direct current used is extremely effective but very slow. It creates a chemical change in the follicle to destroy the root.

Thermolysis Electrolysis - Thermolysis uses shortwave radiofrequency or alternating current (AC). Thermolysis causes the water molecule in your hair to rapidly vibrate, which produces heat. When enough heat is created, thermolysis damages the cells which causes hair growth.

Blend Electrolysis - True to its name, the blend combines both galvanic and thermolysis methods in one treatment. If one type of electrolysis doesn't kill your unwanted hair the other will.

What To Expect

Our hair is constantly changing from several factors that make us who we are, it's in our DNA. It is the diversity that makes proper hair removal through electrolysis a process. As our body reacts to different situations such as hormones, medications, weight, and even our genes, our hair growth patterns change and may activate dormant hair follicles. The complex nature of hair growth controls the number of sessions required to reach your personal preference for hair removal. Generally, electrolysis is typically noticeable within three months and can take up to 12+ months for complete and permanent results. We offer sessions from five minutes to an hour and recommend a weekly schedule to treat the follicle right when it emerges and at the optimal time for optimal reaction. Our goal is to see this process through to ensure complete satisfaction. Each individual has a different tolerance level, and that is taken into account. Modern electrolysis methods can be described as causing a tingling or warming sensation, Topical desensitizing cream can be applied to help ease the sensation. After your treatment, it is common to experience redness or swelling, both of which are usually short-lived. These are both natural reactions from the stimulus applied to the follicle and can be eased with the use of an ice pack and witch hazel. To prevent any additional reactions, it is critical that you inform us of any medical conditions, medication, supplements, lotions, and oils.

Is Electrolysis expensive!

Our fees for electrolysis are in keeping with those for other aesthetic services but considering that electrolysis treatments result in permanent hair removal, the cost is nominal. Estimating the cost of electrolysis is difficult to do, as every client is different. How often you need to come in depends upon many factors like the density of hair as well as previous methods of hair removal, etc. The goal of a consultation is to evaluate the area to be treated and to educate you on your options. At that time, we will set a schedule that works for you, consistency is the most important factor in electrolysis. Over time, we will re-evaluate your progress and together we will reach your goal of being hair-free.

Does Electrolysis work if I've been tweezing or waxing!

Yes! Waxing and tweezing hair increase blood supply to follicles. Hair re-growth will be coarser as a result and may require more treatments than fine hair. That said, you will see permanent results by the end of your treatment program.

How many treatments are required?

The number of treatments required will vary with each person and depend on factors such as the amount of hair in the treatment area, the sensitivity of the skin, medication and hormone balance, previous methods of hair removal, etc. Most clients find that sessions beginning at thirty minutes to one hour work best weekly or every other week. Then, as the different cycles die off, moving to shorter touch-up treatments on a less frequent basis is sufficient. To be completely hair-free can take 18 months to 2+ years (depending on how much hair you have).

Realistic Expectations

It is very important to have expectations that are realistic about electrolysis. Commitment with the treatment program is important, as this is not a one time kind of treatment. Unless the prescribed regimen is followed, permanent hair removal will be limited, could take longer to complete, or may not be achieved at all. Electrolysis restores the cosmetic appearance of an individual through permanent hair removal, but has no direct control over the cause of hair growth. Clients with hormonal irregularities and/or medical conditions that stimulate hair growth will take longer to achieve permanent hair removal.
